Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital Visitation Guidelines

Effective January 2022

Welcome back to Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital! We appreciate your patience over the past year as we sought to keep our patients and staff safe during the COVID pandemic. We are pleased to be able to resume limited, in-person visitation at our hospital.

Hours: 4:00 – 8:00 p.m., daily, at the discretion of a patient's care team.

Details: ONE visitor per day for each patient.

Special requests can be made through the Care Manager.

Visitors must be pre-approved by a patient's care team and submit to screening.

Visitors are not permitted for COVID+ or COVID quarantine patients.

Visitors who do not follow mask requirement will be required to end their visit and exit the facility.

While we are excited to welcome you back to our facility, we ask that you please adhere to the following visitation guidelines:

- Masks are required in all health care facilities in accordance with the CDC and Pennsylvania Department of Health.
- Tight-fitting masks are required for the duration of your visit, both inside and outside the building. Gaiters, bandanas and masks with a valve are not acceptable.
- Practice hand hygiene and social distancing.
- Visitors may not remove their masks to eat or drink during the visit.
- Outside visits above the 1-person limit are not allowed.

- Visitors and patients may leave the patient room during the visit. Both must be masked and maintain social distance from other patients, visitors and staff.
- Visitors may not use the restrooms in the patient room.
- No visitors age 11 or younger.
- All items brought for patients must be given to the nurse, not directly to the patient.
- Pets may visit outside with proof of vaccinations.

These guidelines are in place to keep you, our patients and our staff safe. Please follow the guidance listed above and respect the instruction and guidance of staff.
